THOMAS MERTON, SPIRITUAL NOMAD: THREE TALKS

This year marks the 50th anniversary of the death of Thomas Merton, one of the most influential Catholic writers of the 20th century. Merton was a member of the Order of Cistercians of the Strict Observance (OCSO), also known as the Trappists. To mark the anniversary here in Australia, the Cistercians at Tarrawarra Abbey are holding a series of lectures in August with Fr Michael Casey OCSO. Spend an afternoon in the Yarra Valley, discover the work of one of the 20th century's most prominent theologians and mystics, and experience something of Cistercian life today. A MESSAGE FROM THE ARCHBISHOP'S OFFICE FOR EVANGELISATION: MINISTRY OF COMMUNION TO THE SICK WORKSHOP POSTPONED

Thank you to those who showed an interest in the Ministry of Communion to the Sick Workshop scheduled for Thursday 9 August. After much consultation, we have decided to postpone this event to another time in 2019.
